Cases will be called to trial in the order listed. Unless otherwise directed by the Court, all cases need to appear. **THERE WILL BE NO CALENDAR CALL.** Cases not called to trial will be placed on a two hour call. Cases not reached will be continued to the next civil trial calendar. For all cases, exhibits should be numbered and exchanged with opposing counsel prior to trial. For jury trial cases, a consolidated pre-trial order is due by close of business two weeks prior to the call of the case for trial. Failure to submit a consolidated pre-trial order will be deemed an election to proceed with a bench trial. Jury charges should be submitted in written and electronic MS WORD-format to the staff attorney's email address. Jury charges are due at the call of the case for trial. [fultoncountygga.gov](http://fultoncountygga.gov) Parties are directed to email the staff attorney and provide the estimated length of trial, the chances of settlement, and the results of their mediation of the case. Note the parties are responsible for arranging takedown with a court reporter. The court will not supply a court reporter. Failure to have a court reporter present to report your case may affect an appeal from the ruling of the court. Attorneys advise your clients of this risk. The attorneys or parties should communicate amongst themselves about the selection of a court reporter, the fee arrangements and the scheduling. Judge Krause's court reporter might be an option, at the reporter's discretion and dependent on her availability, and the parties can contact the Court to inquire about her services if they wish so long as they do so two weeks in advance of the start of trial.
